Pastor's Message for April: As we approach Easter it is good to 'survey the wondrous cross' again. Even though Isaiah was prophesying seven or eight hundred years before the event that shook the world, reconciled the universe to God and laid the foundation stone for a new heavens and a new earth, he saw with pinpoint accuracy the cross of Christ and what it meant. Isaiah 52:11 to Isaiah 53:12 is a 'thumbnail' of what actually happened seven or eight hundred years later. It is good to read it. It even better to memorize it, because in memorizing, you are meditating on it day and night. I will highlight some verses so you will see what I mean: 52:14 His appearance was disfigured beyond that of any man, and his form marred beyond all human likeness. If you have seen 'The Passion of the Christ' you will get an idea of the disfiguring which the Roman punishment of scourging caused to the victim. 52:15 So he will sprinkle many nations. His disfiguring and marring brought about your cleansing. 53:3 He was despised and rejected by men, a man of sorrows and familiar with suffering. He was despised back then, and most people still despise Him now. 53:5 But he was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was upon him and by his stripes we are healed. What magnanimity! What a transfer! His scourging healed us from the soul sickness of sin. His piercing meant that we could be forgiven, and more. His crucifixion meant that God could view you as being as righteous as His Son. 53:8 Who can speak of his descendants? He was cut off from the land of the living. He was killed to save you. He did not have any children – to save us. But – but – 53:10 Yet it was the Lord's will to crush him and cause him to suffer. This whole transaction was planned by God. Behold God, our Saviour. The Father planned our salvation. The Son effected it. The Holy Spirit applies it. And regard the following verse: 53:10: He will see his offspring and prolong his days. Verse 8 has just said that Jesus did not have any children. And He didn't. But gloriously, verse 10 says that He will see His offspring! That is not a contradiction. He didn't have any physical children. But, because of His sacrifice, He does have spiritual children. I am one. You are too – if you believe in Him. And the last verse I will bring to your attention today is 53:12 Therefore I will give him a portion with the great, and he will divide the spoils with the strong. What can this mean but the promised Holy Spirit. Joel said, 'In the last days I will pour out my Spirit on all people.' (Joel 2:28). On the strength of what our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ, did on Calvary, God has poured out His Holy Spirit on His people. As Peter said in Acts 2:33 'Exalted to the right hand of God, he has received from the Father the promised Holy Spirit and has poured out what you now see and hear.' (Acts 2:33).

Brothers and sisters, let us praise and thank God for Isaiah 53 and what it prophesies. Let us dwell on Isaiah 53 in the coming weeks, and the gospels, and meditate on the healing you have because of His Stripes.

EASTER information... What happened in the garden of Gethsemane?

"Father, if you are willing, take this cup from me; yet not my will, but yours be done." Luke 22:42

The garden of Gethsemane is a grove of olive trees that is still there today. Some of the trees are over 2,000 years old and would have been young trees at the time Jesus was there on the night he was arrested. Located in Jerusalem, the Temple Mount is just a short walk away across the Kidron Valley. As Jesus prayed in the garden, he could see the temple, and could likely hear the hustle and bustle of people gathering for the Passover.

It is here that he prayed the most agonizing prayer ever to be lifted up. After the Last Supper with his disciples, he took them out to pray in the garden where he predicted Peter's denial and prayed for God's will to be done in him.

Why was Jesus crucified?

The crucifixion of Jesus is one of the most horrifying, yet most startlingly beautiful things that has ever happened. Crucifixion was not unique to Jesus but was a common Roman practice. Criminals, outlaws, and others were regularly crucified in the Roman world. Perhaps the most striking thing about the method of his death was that it was so strikingly common. Crucifixion was not an unusual sight for the people of Israel under Roman occupation. What was unusual is that this man had committed no crime worthy of crucifixion.

In fact, he had committed no crime at all. The Roman governor, Pontius Pilate, was a soldier and a politician known to be cruel in his methods and by no means a softhearted man. Yet even he expressed regret for allowing the crucifixion of Christ to proceed.
