
Una was a long time member of both the Port Albert Methodist and the Wellsford Co-op Parish churches.

Great Is Thy Faithfulness (1923)

While many hymns are born out of a particular dramatic experience, this hymn was simply the result of the author's morning by morning realization of God's personal faithfulness.

Thomas Obadiah Chisholm was born in a log cabin in Kentucky and never had the benefit of high school or advanced training. He began his career as a school teacher at the age of sixteen, in the same country schoolhouse where he had received his elementary training five years later became the associate editor of his hometown weekly newspaper, and at twenty-seven years old, accepted Christ as his personal Savior during a revival meeting. Later, Chisholm was ordained to the Methodist ministry but was forced to resign after a brief pastorate, due to poor health. Chisholm retired in 1953 and spent his remaining years at the Methodist Home for the Aged in Ocean Grove, New Jersey.

PASTOR'S BLURB FOR AUGUST, 2021

Chris and I are reading our way through the Old Testament in the evening. We have just come to Joel. Chris reads the bible aloud, because she can do it more easily. Last night I was taken with one of the verses from Joel: 'And everyone who calls upon the name of the Lord will be saved' (Joel 2:32). I was struck by this verse because it was not too long ago that I had read it in the New Testament. In fact, I had read it *twice* in the New Testament recently. Upon checking, I ascertained that Joel 2:32 is cited by Peter in Acts 2:21, and by Paul in Romans 10:13.

Isn't it interesting that three men, all inspired by the Holy Spirit, all citing the same words, are saying three different things. The words which Joel says just before our verse are: 'The sun will be turned to darkness and the moon to blood before the coming of the great and dreadful day of the Lord.' (Joel 2:31). Joel is telling of God's wrath and coming judgment. But through all of God's terribleness, His kindness shines through. All you have to do is call upon the name of Jesus to be saved. The words which Paul says immediately before he cites the verse are: 'For there is no difference between Jew and Gentile – the same Lord is Lord of all and richly blesses all who call on Him.' (Romans 10:12). Paul is saying that God is no respecter of persons. *Continued on the next page...*

Continued from the previous page... Just as all have sinned, so all can be saved if they put their trust in Jesus. Peter, before he cites our verse, says 'These men are not drunk, as you suppose. It's only nine in the morning.' (Acts 2:15). Peter is explaining the wonderful phenomenon of the Holy Spirit, and the tongues of fire and the miraculous speaking in different languages which accompanied the outpouring of the Holy Ghost. So he cites Joel who prophesied that in 'the last days' (we have been in the last days for the last two thousand years), 'I will pour out my Spirit on all people.' (Acts 2:17).

So let us be reminded of the three lessons through one verse: Thank God that you have escaped the wrath to come, and warn your loved ones about the Day of the Lord. Thank God that you are saved into the one family, which includes Jews and Gentiles. And thank God that He has given you the Holy Spirit by means of Whom you have become a child of God. All these three lessons are taught by this one verse: *And everyone who calls upon the name of the Lord will be saved.*
