# Pastor's Blurb: Children's Talk: 4 Interesting Things About Christmas

1st Interesting Fact Do you ever hear people say that you should have Christmas because Christmas is based on a pagan tradition? Well, they do! People (Christians) say that the 25th December was celebrated by the Romans, and they the Church came along and that the 25th December was a good date to celebrate Jesus' birthday. But in the year 202 AD, Hippolytus wrote that Christians were already celebrating Jesus' birthday on the 25th December. And we know that in AD 274 (72 years later) the emperor Aurelian said that the 25th December should now be the date for celebrating the unconquered sun (Sol Invictus). So the Roman date is the copy cat one! 2nd Interesting Fact We celebrate Jesus' birthday on the 25th December, but it probably wasn't the date He was born on. I still in my mind think of the 25th December at the date when Jesus born, even though I know that it probably wasn't. The reason the church decided it was the 25th December was from a rule that they used to believe in. They thought (it's not in the bible), that a prophet died on the same date that he was conceived on (not that he was born on). So for example, he didn't die at 70 and a half, or 70 and a third. They calculated that Jesus died on the 25th March. So what date was He conceived on? That's right - the 25th March. And you count forward 9 months from the 25th March, and you get the 25th December. 3rd Interesting Fact I know that you know that Santa Claus used to be called Sinter Claus, and that was a . shortened from Saint Nicolas. And I know that you know that he was a very kind man. But did you know that he was the bishop of Myra (in Turkey). And did you know that he gave a poor man who had 3 daughters the money for 3 dowreys and he put the money in three stockings that were hanging by the fireplace. So I believe that that's the origin for gifts in the stockings, and 'coming down the chimney'. Why can I not say that it's the origin of gifts? That's right – the wise men. But now for something really interesting: Santa Claus (Saint Nicolas), the bishop of Myra, was at the council of Nicea, and at the council of Nicea was a man called Arius, who said that Jesus was the eternal Son of God - God created Him. And St Nicolas slapped him in the face.

4th Interesting Fact In the 16th century there were mystery plays. One of them had an evergreen tree hung with apples, one of which was plucked. The date of this mystery play was the 24th December. The 24th December was a 'name day' and it was Adam and Eve's name day. (prince Albert introduced the Christmas tree to England in the 19th century). Isn't it wonderful that Adam and Eve were remembered on the 24th, and Jesus is remembered on the 25th of December.

## Featured Story behind the Hymn: O Come, All Ye Faithful

The hymn, "O Come, All Ye Faithful," was written by John Francis Wade, an 18th century Catholic layman involved in the music business in France. Copies of the hymn migrated to Portugal and then to England. First written in Latin — the original version begins with the words, Adeste Fideles — an Anglican clergyman, Frederick Oakeley, translated it into English. Today it is one of the most popular Advent/Christmas hymns, and is sung by Christians around the world.

One of the reasons for its popularity is the joyful character of its words and music. "O Come, all ye faithful, joyful and triumphant," it says — and the music has a joyful, triumphant lilt to go with the joyful, triumphant words.

The hymn calls us to come to Bethlehem to behold the baby Jesus. It calls us to come and adore him. It reminds us of the angel choir that accompanied Jesus' birth — and of the shepherds who gathered around his cradle. It reminds us that God calls us, too, to sing Christ's praises — and to give him glory in this Christmas season.

Christmas is a busy season, and we have a thousand things on our minds and a thousand things to do. But through it all, let us remember to come and adore the Christ who came into the world in this season to bring us light for our darkness — and joy — and life eternal.
