PARISH MEETINGS FOR 2021

Pastor's Message for February:

Dearly beloved people, Chris and I wish you a Happy New Year. But 'wishing' is a flimsy verb. When we are Christians, we can do better than merely 'wishing'. Chris and I pray for you beloved brothers and sisters nightly. And I want to begin this new year by encouraging you to do the same. It is noteworthy how much of the bible is taken up with the subject of prayer. We have many examples of people praying in the Bibles. We have many exhortations to do so ourselves. We have only gone a few pages from the beginning of the bible when we read, Then people began to call upon the name of the Lord (Genesis 4:26). And the last word in the bible is Amen, forming the conclusion to the fervent prayer of John the Apostle that Jesus would come soon. All the major characters in the bible wrestle in prayer. We see Jacob literally wrestling with God, and he finishes up that unequal tussle with the words, 'I will not let you go, unless you bless me.' Daniel prayed three times a day, even though it meant he risked death by so doing. David is frequently upon the Lord with all his heart. Elijah prayed to the God who answered by fire, on Mount Carmel. Paul and Silas prayed when they were in stocks in prison, causing the whole prison to burst open and the earth to guake. And what God has made prominent in His word – prayer – we should make conspicuous in our lives.

To quote Charles Spurgeon, 'Prayer is the lisping of the believing infant, the shout of the fighting believer, the requiem of the dying saint, falling asleep in Jesus.' If we are really children of God, we will seek our Father's face and live in the Father's love.

I will share a few things to pray for: Pray that this year you will be holy, humble, zealous and patient. Pray that you have closer communion with Christ. Pray that you will, more often, enter the banqueting house of His love. Pray that you will be an example and a blessing to others. Pray that, this year, you might live more and more to the glory of your Master. Chris and I will try to practise what I am preaching, and pray these things for you, and for ourselves. I will leave you with a text that brings it all together: 'Continue in prayer' (Colossians 4:2).
