Words: Carl Gustav Boberg (1859-1940). Translation: Stuart K. Hine (1899-1989).

On a summer afternoon in 1885 a young Swede Carl Gustav Boberg, was walking home with friends from church near Kronoback in south-east Sweden. "It was that time of year when everything seemed to be at its richest colouring," he said, "the birds were singing in trees and everywhere... a thunderstorm appeared on the horizon and soon thunder and lightening. We had to hurry to shelter. But the storm was soon over and the clear sky appeared."

When I came home I opened my window towards the sea. There evidently had been a funeral and the bells were playing the tune of "When eternity's clock calling my saved soul to its Sabbath rest". That evening I wrote the song. The verses were set to a Swedish folk tune, and the first public performance was in a Varmland church in 1888.

Boberg was born in Monsteras, near Kalmar, the son of a carpenter. He worked for the church as a lay minister and wrote many hymns and gospel songs. Boberg was also a politician and for nearly 20 years, between 1912 and 1931 a Swedish parliamentarian.

'How great Thou art' is an international favourite. It has been translated into German, Russian, Welsh, Chinese, Japanese, Polish, Romanian, Spanish, Vietnamese, and Esperanto. A Maori translation was sung for Queen Elizabeth during her 1981 visit, and it went on to spend 6 months in the NZ charts. The version of the hymn that became popular during the Billy Graham crusades was arranged by Tim Spencer, a musician who performed with the famous country music group Sons of the Pioneers.

Pastor's Blurb July 2019:

It is a beautiful exercise to contemplate Jesus. Ephesians 3:8 refers to the 'unsearchable riches of Christ'. For someone who blundered around in the dark for so long, I prize the unsearchable riches of Christ. Let us look at just the tip of the iceberg of the riches. Let us look briefly at the contrasts that are in and around Jesus:

- (a) He is the Man of Sorrows, and yet He says, 'let my joy be in them, so that their joy will be complete'.
- (b) He was cut off from the land of the living, and who can speak of His descendants, but 'he will see the light of life' (Isaiah 53).
- (c) In the humble garb of a Galilean peasant, moving around with a band of fishermen, the friend of publicans and sinners, yet we believe Him by faith to be the Son of the Most High. We know Him to be tired and asleep, yet commanding the winds and the waves.
- (d) When he is dying as a condemned criminal, naked and ashamed, the thief still recognizes Him as Lord, and says, 'Lord, remember me when you come into your kingdom'.
- (e) Today, His name is the most common swear word, and one of the most influential poems written speaks of the killing effect of the breath of 'the pale Galilean', yet by faith we know that He reigns above the heavens and the earth, and that God has given Him a name that is above

every name.
