FOOD BANK/LOAVES AND FISHES has had a busy start to the year. The team have distributed 270 Food Parcels so far. They also distribute Vegetable Bags, in April they gave out 143 Vegetable Bags.

The Inter Church Leaders' Meeting gathers once a month to discuss matters. We are very lucky that the Wellsford churches work so well together.

The church service held in the HERITAGE REST HOME is a very enjoyable affair. Those who attend are a lovely group of people whom it is a privilege to know.

The Story Behind the Hymns...

John H. Sammis was the writer of the Christian hymn *Trust and Obey* in 1887 with music composed by Daniel Towner the year before. Sammis was born in 1846, in Brooklyn, New York and died in 1919 in Los Angeles, California. A man of business who later turned to preaching for a Presbyterian church, John Sammis additionally wrote the popular hymn *He's a Friend of Mine*. He also was a teacher at the Bible Institute of Los Angeles.

The inspiration for this hymn began in 1886 when the composer of the music, Daniel B. Towner, was the music conductor during one of Dwight L. Moody's renowned revivals. Towner offered the following testimony cited by Moody's musical partner, Ira D. Sankey, in his biography, *My Life and the Story of the Gospel Hymns*:

"Mr. Moody was conducting a series of meetings in Brockton, Massachusetts, and I had the pleasure of singing for him there. One night a young man rose in a testimony meeting and said, 'I am not quite sure—but I am going to trust, and I am going to obey.' I just jotted that sentence down and sent it with a little story to the Rev. J. H. Sammis, a Presbyterian minister. He wrote the hymn, and the tune was born."

The text and music first appeared in the 1887 collection, *Hymns Old and New,* and the hymn and has been listed in countless hymnals since then. Methodist hymnals in the United States have included it since 1897.

Pastor's Message for June: THE LORD IS KING

'I am the Lord; there is no other; apart from me there is no God' (Isaiah 45:5). 'Yours, O Lord, is the greatness and the power and the glory and the majesty and the splendour, for everything in heaven and earth is yours. Yours, O Lord, is the kingdom; you are exalted as head over all. (1 Chronicles 29:11). 'Thine be the glory (a hymn). 'Praise to the Lord, the Almighty, the King of creation' (another hymn). 'Reign King Jesus, Reign' (a chorus). The word of God testifies to it. We sing it. The Lord is King of the Universe. I want to be eech you, brothers and sisters, to realize that fact, meditate on it, and rest in it. The Lord is the Sovereign King of creation, and He sits enthroned above the cherubim. The Lord reigns in heaven, and the earth is His footstool (Isaiah 66:1). Now, the astounding fact is that if you believe in the Lord Jesus Christ, God is your Father. 'As a father has compassion on his children, so the Lord has compassion on those who fear him' (Psalm 103:13). Jesus said to Mary, just after He had risen from the dead, 'I am going to my Father, and your Father' (John 20:17). Therefore I can well and truly believe that we (Christians), are 'the apple of His eye' (Psalm 17:8). I want to urge you to use the sovereignty of God (the fact that He rules and reigns over every single thing: everything in the past, everything in the present, and everything in the future), as a pillow to rest your weary heads. Just rest in His sovereignty. Such a pillow will give you rest as you remember things that happened in the past. Resting in the sovereignty of God made it easier for us to cope with our son John's death (he was 18 years old) in 2014. I was tempted to write, 'our son's untimely death', but I haven't written that, because that's the point. John's death wasn't untimely. Of course we grieve, and are still grieving, and we won't ever be the same again, but, even though we grieve, we are at rest. We use the sovereignty of God, our loving heavenly Father, as a pillow. And resting, we have been saved from thinking such agonizing thoughts as 'if only I had....' or 'if only that hadn't happened' or 'if they had only done it this way...' etc etc. John's appointed span was eighteen years and four months, and the Lord, the King, the apple of Whose eye John was, wanted him in heaven. Psalm 139:16 says, 'all the days ordained for me were written in your book before one of them came to be.' Tozer says this much better than I ever could. He said, 'The man of true faith may live in the absolute assurance that his steps are ordered by the Lord. For him, misfortune is outside the bounds of possibility. He cannot be torn from this earth one hour ahead of his time which God has appointed, and he cannot be detained on earth one moment after God is done with him here. He is not a waif of the wide world, a foundling of time and space, but a saint of the Lord and the darling of his particular care.' (Tozer: We Travel An Appointed Way). Brothers and sisters, our Father is God, and He wants us to rest in the fact that, in love, He works everything out for your good, because you are the apple of His eye.
