PASTOR'S BLURB FOR JUNE 2023

This morning's reading took me to the book of Acts: "But Stephen, full of the Holy Spirit, looked up to heaven and saw the glory of God, and Jesus standing at the right hand of God. 'Look,' he said, 'I see heaven open and the Son of Man standing at the right hand of God.' At this they covered their ears and, yelling at the top of their voices, they all rushed at him, dragged him out of the city and began to stone him. Meanwhile, the witnesses laid their coats at the feet of a young man named Saul. While they were stoning him, Stephen prayed, 'Lord Jesus, receive my spirit.' Then he fell on his knees and cried out, 'Lord, do not hold this sin against them.' When he had said this, he fell asleep. And Saul approved of their killing him." (Acts 7:55 – 8:1). The disciples asked Jesus (before He had gone to the cross), 'What will be the signs of the end of the age?' He answered that His followers would be persecuted and hated and be put to death.' I would not be so foolhardy as to identify now as the 'end of the age'. But anyone can see that the days are getting fewer when Christians will be able to 'fly under the radar' of society, and so avoid persecution. Whether we like it or not, the days are coming, and are now here, in which some Christians, to continue to be true to Jesus, are bringing down the wrath of the government and its mad-made laws, such as the law of 'hate-speech' upon themselves. Be of good cheer! We can learn from Stephen. He was living in tumultuous times too, but he was a zealous and obedient Christian, and did not shy away from speaking up when his time came. What can we learn from him? 1. When his time came, and he realized that he had to speak for Jesus, he was not stammering and shrinking from the spotlight. He had the face of an angel. The Lord was right there by Stephen's side, helping him. When your time comes, and you realize that you must speak up for Jesus, the Lord will be right there by your side as well, and you will have the face of an angel. 2. When the situation got dangerous for Stephen, he did not flinch and back down. He was caught up in his witnessing till the last second, even having the presence and the peace of mind to pray a prayer of forgiveness for his killers. 3. His words had limitless effects. Saul, who approved of the killing at the time, never forgot Stephen's words. The fact that Stephen was prepared to die for the truth of what he believed, had a profound impact on Saul. Stephen's words did not influence Saul right then and there, but given time, they had a life-changing effect on him, and he became the world's greatest missionary. You cannot know the effect of your words. Be bold, and cast your bread upon the waters, and leave the result to God. He will reap a colossal harvest from your bravery. Be encouraged by Stephen's example!

The Story behind the Hymns History of Hymns: 'Crown Him with Many Crowns' Source: Chat GPT

The Methodist hymn "Crown Him with Many Crowns" is a well-known Christian hymn that celebrates the sovereignty and majesty of Jesus Christ. It was written by Matthew Bridges in 1851 and later revised by Godfrey Thring in 1874. The hymn's lyrics depict Jesus as the conqueror of sin and death, the ruler of all creation, and the object of worship and adoration. It expresses the belief that Jesus is deserving of praise, honour, and crowns from all people, both in heaven and on earth.

Today, "Crown Him with Many Crowns" continues to inspire and uplift worshippers around the world, serving as a reminder of Christ's sovereignty and the hope found in his redemptive work.
