PASTOR'S BLURB FOR MARCH 2023

"On that day a fountain will be opened to the house of David and the inhabitants of Jerusalem to cleanse them from sin and impurity. On that day I will banish the names of the idols from the land, and they will be remembered no more,' declares the Lord Almighty." (Zechariah 13:1-2). This was our reading when, as a family, we had our devotion this morning. We read on: "Awake, sword, against my shepherd, against the man who is close to me. Strike the shepherd and the sheep will be scattered" (Zechariah 13:7). Jesus quoted this last verse as He was being arrested. He knew that Zechariah was prophesying about Him, and that once the 'sword' would come against Him, His disciples would scatter (which they did). 'That day' was, of course, the time of Jesus's crucifixion when God would open a fountain (the death of Jesus) to propitiate His wrath against His people's sins and explate their guilt by cleansing them whiter than snow (Isaiah 1:18; 1 John 1:9). We read on: ' "In the whole land", declares the Lord, "two thirds will be struck down and perish, yet one third will be left in it. This third I will put into the fire. I will refine them like silver and test them like gold. They will call on my name and I will answer them; I will say, 'They are my people; and they will say, 'The Lord is our God.'" (Zechariah 13:9). Do you remember in January's Pastor's Blurb I quoted Zephaniah 1:3 'I will sweep away the idols that cause the wicked to stumble', and I urged all of you to have an idol-free February? Well, everybody who believes in Jesus is part of that 'one third' (the remnant) who will be refined like silver and tested like gold. Chris and I are part of that 'one third', and the Lord, in love, is refining us by severely damaging (through the flood) our rental property in Sunnynook. Praise God that He should love us so much that He refines us by sweeping away our idols. In what way is the Lord, in love, sweeping away your idols?

<u>The Story behind the Hymns – Credit Link</u> <u>"It Only Takes a Spark (Pass it On)"</u>

Honestly over the past few months, this is my most favourite church song – please have a listen!

It only takes a spark to get a fire going, and soon all those around can warm up in its glowing.

That's how it is with God's love once you've experienced it. you spread his love to everyone; you want to pass it on. *

If you are a baby boomer, raised in the church, and born in the late 1940s or 1950s, you probably grew up singing Kurt Kaiser's "Pass It On" around a campfire or at youth group meetings.

Kurt Frederic Kaiser (1934-2018) was born in Chicago. He received his musical education from the American Conservatory of Music and Northwestern University (B.M., 1958; M.M., 1959).

In correspondence with the author, Mr. Kaiser provided the background to "Pass It On," one of his most famous songs: "In 1969, Ralph Carmichael and I collaborated on a musical, Tell It Like It Is. It was written to get young people involved in the Church. After reviewing what we had written, we decided there needed to be a closer, a modern 'Just As I Am' [a hymn by Charlotte Elliott written in 1835, and a favourite of Evangelicals for altar calls].

"On a Sunday night I was sitting in our den by the fireplace where there were remnants of a fire, and it occurred to me that it only takes a spark to get a fire going . . . and the rest came very quickly. My wife suggested that I should say something about shouting it from mountain tops, and that ended up in the third verse. It only took about 20 minutes to write the lyrics. Afterwards my wife and I went for a walk, letting the song ruminate in our minds."

This YouTube site offers the opportunity to hear Kurt Kaiser play "Pass It On" in a Joy of Music program hosted by organist Diane Bish. His presentation begins at 4 minutes into the recording. It reflects the artistry of his classical training as well as his improvisational skills. Following the song, the composer offers a witness to his faith. A second YouTube site presents an informal reflection by the composer at Laity Lodge in the Texas Hill Country.

This song reflects the power of a simple idea set to a singable tune. Such songs take on a life that the composer never considered. Mr. Kaiser notes, "I am always amazed how the Lord can take a little song and use it to reach so many people. It has been sung at countless weddings and funerals, at ordination services, by the Sea of Galilee, in Rhodesia, on the aircraft carrier Enterprise, and lots of camps."
