
# What's Happening in November?

Food Bank Update: We are very happy with the new freezer. We now have 3 freezers in constant use. We have purchased a metal trolley with bigger wheels, and this is proving to be fit for purpose. We are working towards our Christmas parcels. Because of the difficulty getting the volume of goods and not being able to store perishables for any length of time we have decided to change our parcel this year to a 'Christmas Treat Box'. This is designed to provide the extra goodies above the normal groceries to help families have a brighter Christmas. We have distributed 6 donation boxes to local stores with a list of grocery items we would like donated. The last 3 months has seen a slow done in requests as predicted. We are anticipating this to increase again because of the high inflation rate, as mortgages come up for renewal, petrol prices increasing again, and the current higher living costs make stretching the family income more difficult. From 1 July to 30 September, we distributed 210 food parcels plus 100 vegetable parcels. These helped feed 635 Adults and 350 Children. We also distributed 17 Isolation parcels to families isolating with COVID19. We are planning for a busy November and December.

We are always thankful of our volunteers for all the hours they donate every week. We continue to be grateful to the Wellsford Co-Operating Parish for your ongoing support to help the growing number of families in need in our community. (Karen Lennon)

## **PASTOR'S BLURB FOR NOVEMBER 2022**

I've just heard a marvellous sermon on Jesus' words, 'You are the salt of the earth. But if the salt loses its saltiness, how can it be made salty again? It is no longer good for anything, except to be thrown out and trampled by men. You are the light of the world. A city on a hill cannot be hidden. Neither do people put light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead, they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house.' (Matthew 5:13-16). We have all heard many sermons on 'you are the salt of the earth.... you are the light of the world', but this sermon was somehow different. The preacher gave me a new insight into the phrase 'if the salt loses its saltiness...' He said that salt loses its saltiness when it succumbs to its environment. Moisture is usually in air surrounding salt: that's why it has to be kept in a watertight dry container. Wet salt is good for nothing. When Christians succumb to their environment, and start to resemble their environment, they have lost their distinctive saltiness. In what way have we, as individual Christians, or the denominations that you know, 'succumbed to the environment'? In other words, the world is always changing. In 2022 certain behaviour is tolerated, or even celebrated, which, for the vast proportion of the centuries of Christendom, would have been thought to sinful even to mention. But now the world practises it. The question is, have you conformed to the patterns of this world? In other words, have you lost your saltiness? If you have not lost your saltiness, you are going to encounter opposition somewhere along the way, just like someone who stops and turns around, and starts walking in the opposite direction which everybody else is walking in. You're going to get more than a few murmurs of complaint and you're going to be told to 'watch where you're going!' But with every murmur you endure, you are blessed, because Jesus said, 'Blessed are you when you are persecuted and have things falsely said about you, because great is your reward in heaven.' Daniel was a fiercely salty person. He did not cave into his environment in the least. He was told, by imperial edict, that he was forbidden to pray to his God, on pain of being thrown to the hungry lions. Daniel read the royal edict, and he went right on visibly praying regardless. That's salty! And look at the results: the king gave another decree that every single person in his kingdom 'must fear and reverence the God of Daniel'. Now that's a witness. Dare to be as salty as Daniel was!

And the preacher gave some memorable points about *light* as well. What is the main feature of light? Well – it's visible. Sometimes when I was young, I was told to go to sleep because my parents had turned off the light, I used to wait till the 'coast was clear', and get my torch, and read under the bedclothes. To this day I don't know whether my torchlight would have been visible to my parents. But this is exactly what Jesus means when He says that light isn't made to be invisible. In the normal course of your week, can you think of anything you do – or more tellingly – *say* – that marks you out as a follower of Jesus? It is a challenging question for me. How would you answer that?

Let us pray for each other, that we would salty salt, and bright lights.

# The Story behind the Hymns - Credit Link

## When The Roll Is Called Up Yonder Hymn History

This song was first published in 1893 under a collection entitled Songs of the Soul. It is the product of James Milton Black (1856 – 1938).

It draws its inspiration from the Book of Life in the Bible and the absence of a child in Black's Sunday school class when attendance was taken.

He visited this absent child only to discover that she was suffering from pneumonia. After calling the doctor to attend to her, Black went home with a downcast face.

This was before the advent of antibiotics and Black knew that the chances of her recovering were slim. Black searched for a song that talked about a heavenly call but found none.

It was then that he felt impressed to write one himself. That was born this hymn When the Roll Is Called Up Yonder.

A few days later Black sang this song at the funeral of this girl and shared with the people the circumstances that led him to compose this song.

It was first published in the hymn book, Songs of The Soul. It is now one of the most popular Christian hymns and has been translated into many languages found in countries all over the world.

The message of the song is that we should all aim to be on the right side when God calls the roll of those to enter heaven.

It is based on 1 Thessalonians 4: 16, "For the Lord himself shall descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of the archangel, and with the trump of God: and the dead in Christ shall rise first."
