Pastor's Blurb November 2019:

Dear people, how are you? I always love the beginning to John's third epistle: "Dear friend, I pray that you may enjoy good health and that all may go well with you, even as your soul is getting along well." (3 John 2). Indeed, so much do I enjoy the beginning to John's third epistle, that I often start my letters by plagiarizing it (not really plagiarizing: I usually give the reference). But my question was genuine. How are you getting along? If you are getting along as well as I hope - in other words, if you are enjoying the life of Christ in you, and are being vitalized by serving Him all day long – you should be aware of the warfare that we're involved in. You should be aware of what John says in his first epistle: 'The whole world lies in the grasp of the evil one (1 John 5:19). I was taken with something that I read in the latest Reformed journal: 'Modern humanity in the West rebels against the sovereignty of God in His creation of reality, and creates (as best they can) a new and different reality for humanity with all the implications of this new reality for the fundamental institutions of marriage and family. Man determines reality for himself. This sovereign determination of his or her sex by humans themselves ignores the will of God as revealed both in nature and in Scripture and bases itself on feeling. And later I read this: The writer was guoting a prominent philosopher: "At the heart of liberty is the right to define one's own concept of existence, of meaning, of the universe, and of the mystery of human life". And then the writer of the Reformed journal says: 'A high priest of old Baal could not have rejected the sovereignty of the God of Israel more clearly and defiantly.'

The allusion to Baal was very apt. Christians these days find themselves in the position of Elijah. May we pray that we will have the courage, the obedience and the zeal of Elijah as we witness to the real God, the God who answer by fire.

Featured Story behind the Hymn: Thine be the Glory

Edmond L. Budry wrote "A Toi la Gloire," "Thine Be the Glory," in 1884, reportedly after the death of his first wife, Marie de Vayenborg. It was first published in *Chants Evangeliques* in Lausanne, Switzerland, 1885. It was translated into English in 1925 by Richard B. Hoyle, and appeared in *Cantate Domino Hymnal*, 1925, the hymnal of the World Student Christian Federation.

It is possible that an Advent hymn by Friedrich-Heinrich Ranke (1798-1876), using the same tune by Handel, and published in *Evangelisches Gesangbuch fur Elsass-Lothringern,* could have been the basis for "Thine Be the Glory."


