1st Sunday of Advent: Hope - Isaiah 9:2-6

2nd Sunday of Advent: Peace - Isaiah 40:3-5

"A voice of one calling: "In the wilderness prepare the way for the LORD; make straight in the desert a highway for our God. Every valley shall be raised up, every mountain and hill made low; the rough ground shall become level, the rugged places a plain. And the glory of the LORD will be revealed, and all people will see it together. For the mouth of the LORD has spoken."

3rd Sunday of Advent: Joy - Isaiah 12:2-6

4th Sunday of Advent: Love - Luke 1:46-55

These verses help to focus on the different aspects of the Advent season and the anticipation of the arrival of Jesus. Many churches and individuals incorporate these passages into their Advent devotions and worship services as a way of preparing their hearts and minds for the celebration of Christmas.

PASTOR'S BLURB FOR DECEMBER 2023

Brothers and sisters, this month I step aside to make room for a truly great saint and writer, Charles Spurgeon, and quote his Christmas meditation, on Isaiah 7:14 Behold a virgin shall conceive, and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel.

Let us today go down to Bethlehem, and in company with wondering shepherds and adoring Magi, let us see Him who was born King of the Jews, for we by faith can claim an interest in Him, and can sing, "Unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given." Jesus is Jehovah incarnate, our Lord and our God, and yet our brother and friend: let us adore and admire. Let us notice at first glance His miraculous conception. It was a thing unheard of before, and unparalleled since, that a virgin should conceive and bear a Son, The first promise ran thus, "The seed of the woman," not the offspring of the man. Since venturesome woman led the way in the sin which brought forth Paradise lost, she, and she alone, ushers in the Regainer of Paradise. Our Saviour, although truly man, was as to His human nature, the Holy One of God. Let us reverently bow before the holy Child whose innocence restores to manhood its ancient glory; and let us pray that that He may be formed in us, the hope of glory. Fail not to note His humble parentage. His mother has been described simply as "a virgin", not a princess, or prophetess, nor a matron of large estate. True, the blood of kings ran in her veins; nor was her mind a weak and untaught one, for she could sing most sweetly a song of praise; but yet how humble her position, how poor the man to whom she stood affianced, and how miserable the accommodation afforded to the new-born King!

Immanuel, God with us in our nature, in our sorrow, in our lifework, in our punishment, in our grave, and now with us, or rather we with Him, in resurrection, ascension, triumph, and Second Advent splendour.

The hymn "Beauty for Brokenness" is also known as "God of the Poor" and "Let Your Glory Fall." It was written by Graham Kendrick, a British Christian singer and songwriter who is well-known for his contributions to contemporary Christian music.

"Beauty for Brokenness" is a hymn that focuses on themes of God's mercy, compassion, and the transformation of broken lives. It acknowledges the brokenness and suffering in the world and expresses a longing for God to bring healing, restoration, and beauty out of the brokenness. The hymn calls for God's justice to flow like a river and for His love to cleanse and renew the world.

The hymn is a powerful expression of the Christian faith's emphasis on God's ability to bring hope and transformation to those who are broken and in need. It has been widely used in Christian worship services and has resonated with many people who find comfort and inspiration in its message.

Graham Kendrick wrote "Beauty for Brokenness" in the 1990s, and it has since become a popular and enduring hymn in the Christian worship repertoire. It is often sung in churches and other Christian gatherings as a prayer for God's healing and renewal in the midst of a broken and hurting world.
