Ann Clegg attended the beginning of our committee meeting on Tuesday 3 May. It was lovely to have Ann with us and we were grateful for the opportunity to talk about how the Church and the Foodbank can work together to help our communities in need.

A new Foodbank Executive Committee has been confirmed as follows

Food parcel Co-Ordinator is Lee Twiss.

Karen will be the liaison person with the Co-Op Parish going forward. We continue to appreciate the parish support and use of the facilities and power.

A new freezer has been ordered and we are expecting its arrival sometime in May. We will move an old freezer out to the Kitchen where the place has been cleared beside the fridge. The new one will go into the Foodbank room. A locking system will be fixed to the freezer in the kitchen. The extra freezer space is needed to help manage the growing weekly demand we currently have for food parcels. Continued over...

A box will be set up in the Church foyer to receive any food donations from the congregation and others. Lee will clear this regularly. We also have boxes at other churches in Wellsford.

Rat and Mouse traps have been set in the hall, storerooms, and kitchen as we are aware that with the colder weather our little friends will be seeking warmer accommodation. We have also put little lids of ant poison in the kitchen to help eradicate the ants problem.

April was another busy month for food parcels with a total of 118 food parcels and 61 vegetable parcels going out to those in need. 13 of those were for Isolating families. This helped 175 Adults and 212 children.

PASTOR'S BLURB FOR JUNE 2022

THREE PIECES OF NEWS FROM UKRAINE

I want to share three pieces of news from Ukraine. The first is a personal physical report about a woman 'on the ground' in Ukraine. It is a brief glimpse of the war's impact on one woman, and it is taken from the Slavic Gospel Association's latest newsletter. The second and third pieces of news concern the spiritual dimension of the war in Ukraine.

The beginning of Lyudmila's story... In the night of February 23rd into February 24th, the Russian-Ukrainian war caught Lyudmila during her daily duty as a nurse in the hospital. Her life, like the lives of many, would go on as usual (she thought). She would go to work until the very last day (she thought). Her colleagues at the hospital at the hospital, like Lyudmila, did not believe that the war could begin, although before the invasion, there was a lot of tension in the media. The news constantly reported that Russia had amassed many of their troops on the border with Ukraine and could invade our territory. Most Ukrainians did not expect such a deceit from their close neighbours. No one could have imagined that Russia, the 'fraternal people' would attack Ukraine. After all, everyone remembered that during the WWII, Russians and Ukrainians fought together shoulder to shoulder, and now one 'brother' turned on the other brother. Everyone was shocked and paralyzed when they learned about the Russian attack.

Lyudmila said that in Kamianske they did not hear the first explosions that sounded throughout Ukraine. They learned about the bombing of Kharkov at 5 am from the internet. Then Lyudmila and her colleagues found out that other peaceful Ukrainian cities were shelled and bombed. All hospital staff gathered in one place. They were in panic, fear and uncertainty. Everyone was lost, asking one single question: 'What will happen to us and how to live on?' When Lyudmila returned home from work, her family gathered to discuss the next steps. They spent most of their free time monitoring the internet and watched news about Russia, until March the 4th. Lyudmila was going to work and did not want to quit, then her sister Svetlana convinced her that she must go to a safe place, to save the children, as it has been already too dangerous in the neighbouring Dnipro city. Sirens sounded endlessly....

First spiritual piece of news: Not only does Putin want Ukraine, but the Russian Orthodox leadership want the break-away (Baptist) churches under Russian Orthodox control. The Russian Orthodox leadership are right behind Putin, and if Russia wins, it will make it hard for the 2,300 Baptist churches SGA (Slavic Gospel Society) is involved with, and for all Christian churches and ministries not orthodox. Ukraine is a spiritual battlefield as well.

Second spiritual piece of news: Slavic Gospel Society leaders say that thousands of people are coming to their churches and repenting and converting because of the war.

Pray for the people of Ukraine and Russia that more people will become believers because of the war. Love from your brother,

Story Behind the Song: All Creatures of our God and King

St. Francis of Assisi, who was born in 1181 in what Italy is now, is credited with the lyrics to "All Creatures of Our God and King." The lyrics are adapted from "The Canticle of the Sun" (*Canticum Solis*), a poem he wrote during the last year of his life. Written at a time when he was weak and struggled with periods of temporary blindness, St. Francis wished to express the unity he felt with nature and the feelings of peace he experienced as his earthly life ended.

Nearly 700 years after the death of St. Francis of Assisi, in 1906, music editor Ralph Vaughan Williams published the version of "All Creatures of Our God and King" that we know today. It first appeared in the English hymnal for the Church of England and was later added to the LDS hymnbook. On *Glory! Music of Rejoicing*, an album by the Mormon Tabernacle Choir, the song "Psalm 148" is included, which uses the same music as "All Creatures of Our God and King" but with different lyrics.
